SUBJECT: GRIEVANCES OF THE MAJORITY OF THE GOVERNMENT PUBLIC SERVICE STAFF REGARDING THE NEW SALARY STRUCTURE AND SUBSEQUENT SALARY ADJUSTMENTS

With reference to the above-stated subject, we respectfully wish to advise Your Highness of our grievances with regard to the New Salary Structure approved for the Tonga Public Service, as per Cabinet Decision No. 697 of 30 June, 2005, and the salary adjustments conveyed to our respective Ministries. We feel that the new structure and adjustments are unfair and unjustifiable for the following reasons:

- 1. The New Salary Structure and subsequent salary adjustments does not reflect the impact of the current cost of living;
- 2. The financial implication of this New Salary Structure and subsequent salary adjustments ultimately perpetrated inequitable distribution of resources and complete disregard of social justice;
- 3. There is distinct discrepancies between the salaries of the Head of Departments, Hon. Ministers and the rest of the public service from Level 2 downwards, which does not accurately reflect the level and magnitude of our respective responsibilities;
- 4. The salary adjustments are inconsistent throughout the public service as some have higher percentage increase than others who are in the same level;
- 5. Some new recruits with no experience have higher percentage (%) salary increase than the existing incumbents of the same level;
- 6. This New Salary Structure and subsequent salary adjustments clearly disregarded work performances, experience, and qualifications of most civil servants;
- 7. The New Salary Structure and subsequent salary adjustments clearly highlighted the absence of good governance, transparency and accountability;
- 8. The New Salary Structure and subsequent salary adjustments were not done well by the Higher Salary Review Committee and Public Service Commission;
- 9. There was insufficient consultations between Ministries/Departments and the Higher Salary Review Committee and the Public Service Commission, and
- 10. The New Salary Structure and subsequent salary adjustments clearly disputed the principles of human rights and social justice.

Given the above, we respectfully recommend the following for Your Highness's kind and favourable consideration:

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- That the approved New Salary Structure based on the Job Descriptions Evaluation be reconsidered;
- 2) That the proposed new salary adjustment be based on the old Salary Scale and be revised as follows:

OLD LEVELS	PERCENTAGE (%) INCREASE
Level 2 - 5	60
Levels 6 - 10	70
Levels 11 – 14A	80

- 3) That the cost of approximately T\$20.0m for the above proposed New Salary Structure, as per detailed in Annex I, be financed as follows:
 - The Current Budget Allocation for 2005/2006 Financial Year (T\$3.6); and
 - A soft loan of approximately T\$16.4m by the Government from our Retirement Fund and/or other financial institutions;
- That the Soft Loan from our Retirement Fund be payable in two years.

In order to restore the loyalty, work moral and performance of affected Civil Servants and the sustainability of the service of Government to Tonga, we would appreciate a response from Your Highness with regard to our above recommendations to be received within three(3) working days.

As Government is the largest employer in Tonga, a significant percentage of the livelihood of Tonga's population depends on the income of the Civil Servants. We, therefore, pray for Your Highness's kind and favourable consideration.
